- **Xerus** is another name for an African ground squirrel. You say the 'X' like a letter 'Z'.
- 2. There are four different types of African ground squirrels Cape, Damara, striped and unstriped.
- 3. Their claws aren't strong enough to climb trees, but they can dig underground burrows with them.
- 4. When they need to get clean, they bathe in dust.
- 5. If they spot a predator, lots of ground squirrels rush at it at the same time and try to block it with their bushy tails.



They talk to each other in chirps and squeaks, but it's not all cute – they can also growl.

. Thanks to their double coats, yaks can survive temperatures as low as -40°C. **Yak** fur makes cosy wool.

- 2. Yaks even go for icy lake baths when the temperature is very low.
- 3. There aren't many wild **yaks** left most yaks are domesticated.
- 4. Even though they are big, they still have predators, such as the Tibetan wolf, bears and snow leopards.
- **5.** In treeless parts of Tibet, people use dried **yak** dung to make fire instead of firewood.

- 2. Each **zebra**'s stripes are unique and a foal can recognise its mum from her stripes.
- 3. Foals are born with brown and white stripes.
- 4. **Zebras** can gallop at speeds of up to 65 kilometres (40 miles) per hour. They really can outpace a lion.
- 5. Every year, they migrate over 2,800 kilometres (1,800 miles) looking for grass to eat.
